# Meeting Minutes— August

Location: Bristol Hill United Methodist Church, 4826 County Line Rd, Kansas City, KS

The meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m.

#### **Board of Director Reports**

The show volunteer sign-up book was circulated during the meeting. We particularly need shuttle bus drivers on Sunday, evening security volunteers, helpers Thursday and Friday in the trailer parking area, and a couple shifts need to be filled at the Welcome Table.

President, Ed Mardiat: We're very excited about our Grand National [GN] Show next weekend! We've worked very hard, and please get into the fun mode! The Weld Wheels event is sold out, with 170 people signed up to attend. Everyone, please check the online auction site at https://

mca2017grandnational.auction-bid.org. There are over 60 items posted. It does not require an application to be downloaded – just go to the website. It's fun and easy to use. You just register your name, cell phone number, and credit card info. It's open now, and closes at 3 p.m. next Saturday, when items will be distributed to the winning bidders.

We have three free seminars scheduled on Saturday afternoon.

- Weld Wheels is doing a session on how to size and fit custom wheels to your car.
- Motion U is doing training on using its database to advertise auto events.
- Gary Patterson, from Shelby American, will provide news about their performance cars.

Show participants will receive wrist-

bands in their packets for admission to the BBQ and the Breakfast Buffet. The Tailgate BBQ is Friday, from 6-8 p.m. Be sure to wear your favorite sports team apparel. The Breakfast Buffet is served on Sunday from 9-10 a.m. Please arrive by 9:45 for the presentation of colors, video presentation, and keynote speaker. Henry Ford III will not attend, and is being replaced as keynote speaker by Mark Schuler from Ford. The show awards presentation starts at 11:30 a.m.

**Vice President Nona Hernandez:** No report.

**Secretary, Jan Somerville:** The Salvation Army Bell Ringing date is Sat. Nov. 18<sup>th</sup>. There was also an update to the WWFS/HFT report. The minutes were accepted as corrected.

**Treasurer, George Stegner:** Please reference the Treasurer Report dated 07/31/2017, which was accepted as read.

Show Director, Jim Peterson: Setup begins at 8 a.m. on Thursday. Early classification and registration for club volunteers will be from 4-6 p.m. on Thursday. On Thursday, volunteers should park in the small lot near the traffic circle on Lamar and 110<sup>th</sup> Street – on the north or west end. Friday - Sunday volunteers will have to park in the spectator lot at Black and Veatch (across College Ave from the Overland Park Convention Center).

BBQ/Brunch admission wristbands will be in your registration packet. Show T-Shirts may be picked up near the registration tables. Volunteers entered in the show may go through classification and registration on Thursday evening. Follow the signs to classification. There will be two lines: one for indoor parking, and one for outside parking. Volunteers helping with classification should be there at 3:30 p.m. (practice for Friday and Saturday).

The last meeting of the GN Show Committee will be on Monday night at the OPCC. Larry Crist has park-

ing volunteers doing a walk-thru at 6 p.m.

Several club members have name badges to pick up. See Jim today. You may also pick up your name badges at the GN Welcome Table.

Past President, R.J. Coberly: The Sponsorship and Vendor work is done! We expect \$16,975 in sponsor cash donations, of which \$12,625 has been collected. The Overland Park Visitor Bureau room rebate is the largest portion of the balance due. The value of cashequivalent donations and silent auction items is estimated to be about \$23K. (Cash equivalent donations are items or services we didn't have to pay for, e.g. signs and banners, show programs, video production, and silent auction items donated by sponsors/vendors). The total sponsor and vendor contribution to our GN Show is estimated at \$39,810. (This does not include silent auction proceeds.)

We really have some great sponsors! All the National MCA sponsors are coming to our GN Show. We have 5 semi-trailers rolling in on Thursday, and quite a few vendors. In separate drawings at the show, Bob Allen Ford and B.F. Goodrich are each giving away sets of four tires.

Social Directors, Don and Linda Lankard: Don and Linda gave their report to the membership, details will be published in the newsletter.

Ed added some info to our club calendar about the 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Guys and Gears Benefit Car Show, on Sat. Oct. 7<sup>th</sup>, to benefit KU Cancer Research. The show location is at the Furniture Deals lot at 107<sup>th</sup> and Metcalf, \$20 preregistration fee (includes show T-shirt) or \$15 on day of the show (no t-shirt).

#### **Old Business**

Wounded Warrior Family Support/ High Five Tour [WWFS/HFT], Mark Raab: RJ, George, and Ed brought back both the Shelby GT 350 and the Ford Super Duty mobility-equipped truck for events in the KC area. The Shelby will be displayed inside, and the F250 outside at the GN Show. The WWFS organization provides support to combatwounded veterans and their families. Collaborating with the VA, WWFS has provided over 60 mobilityequipped vehicles to combatwounded disabled veterans. This year's goal is to fund a brain trauma center. This weekend alone, WWFS/HFT gained \$1K from Laird Knoller Ford in Topeka, and \$1,710 from the five-member Topeka Mustang Club. The Air National Guard 190<sup>th</sup> Air Refueling Wing requested the car at their Golf Tournament on Friday, and this informal visit gained another \$160 toward WWFS. Meanwhile, Ed Mardiat visited the UAW plant in Claycomo, MO, where he was given a whopping \$10K donation to WWFS. The vehicles also visited the U.S. Marine Corps League convention. We thank Blue Springs Ford for their \$1,100 donation yesterday. "Bruno," the F 250 mobility-equipped truck, is valued at over \$90K. There is a crane concealed in the pickup bed, which can be deployed to position a power chair and place the driver either in the cab or on the ground. This gives them a great deal of independence and an opportunity to be mobile and productive. Colonel John Folsom will be issuing a challenge to all MCA Clubs at the Awards Banquet. Clubs that earn at least \$5K toward WWFS will be eligible for a drawing for Ms. Divine K – which will be auctioned at Barrett-Jackson in Scottsdale, AZ next year. The proceeds from the auction would then be sent to the winning MCA club's charity of choice – a win-win situation!

Nominating Committee, Lorne Willard: We have a list of members eligible for office. You must have attended at least 6 meetings during the previous 12 months, and have been a member for at least a

year. We need people willing to serve - all positions are open. We are hoping to split up some of the terms, so that we don't have to change the entire Board of Directors at once. The President, Treasurer, and one Member-at-Large will be encouraged to serve for two years. and we'd like to get people to serve one term as Vice-President, Secretary, Social Director, and Member-at-Large. In the future, we hope to change only half of the officers annually. Our by-laws allow officers to serve two consecutive years in the same position. Lorne will contact all eligible members soon, encouraging them to serve. Please let Lorne know if you have an interest in a particular office, or if you'd like to nominate/ recommend someone as an officer.

## Letter From the Editor—By Lorne Willard

When Jill and I joined the Vintage Mustang Club of Kansas City shortly after attending the clubs 1996 show, it took us a little while to realize that that event wasn't a "typical" show because it was the 3<sup>rd</sup> time the club had hosted an MCA National show (previous shows were in 1990 and 1994). Like many of our members, we weren't quite yet versed in what MCA was all about, but regardless we jumped right into the show planning process gathering goody bag and door prize items and trophy sponsorships for a couple of regional shows before getting more firsthand knowledge when we hosted another MCA National show in 1999. After that, I was well versed and became show director for our 2000 regional and the clubs first MCA Grand National in 2001. As the Vintage Mustang Club, we struggled with membership as many prospective members incorrectly thought membership hinged on ownership of the early cars, so after our 2005 MCA National show and the introduction of the new body style, the thought of hosting another MCA National was put off for a few years. This was absolutely one of the smoothest run MCA Shows I've been to and I've been to a few!
